

## Instructions for Making a Forest Fire Board Game Board

### Materials you will need:

- Large cardboard or piece of styrofoam
- Colored papers
- Markers and paints
- Pair of scissors
- Glue
- Dice
- Small pieces or pawns
- Tabs with questions and answers

### Construction Steps:

#### Find a name for your game

##### 1. Dashboard Design:

- Start with a large piece of cardboard or styrofoam that will act as the base of the board.
- Design paths for players to follow. You can design a forest with various points of interest such as fire stations, rivers and trees.

##### 2. Dashboard Decoration:

- Use colored papers and markers to decorate the board. Make it look like a forest by adding elements like trees, bushes and animals.
- Add squares or circles along the path where players will stop to answer questions or perform actions.

##### 3. Construction of the Moving Parts:

- Use small figures or pawns for the players.
- You can make your own cardboard pawns or use small toys.

##### 4. Creating the Question and Answer Tabs:

- With the help of your teacher, prepare flashcards with questions about forest fires. Each tab should have one question and four answer choices, one of which will be correct.
- Divide the tabs into categories such as fire prevention, fire action, and environmental effects of fires.

##### 5. Dice Selection and Game Rules:

- Use a dice to move players. Each player will roll the dice and move corresponding steps on the board.
- When a player stops on a certain square, they will have to answer a question. If he answers correctly, he will advance an extra step. If he answers incorrectly, he will remain in his place.
- The goal of the game is for the player to reach the end of the path while learning important information about fires and how to prevent them.
